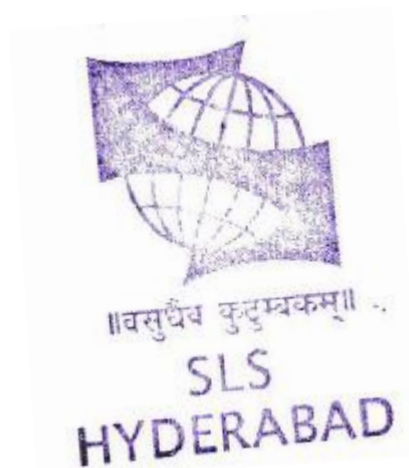

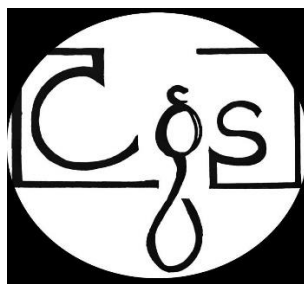

EVENT REPORT

PANEL DISCUSSION ON – COMBATING VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN- ROLE OF YOUTH ORGANIZED BY CENTRE FOR GENDER STUDIES, SYMBIOSIS LAW SCHOOL, HYDERABAD

Date: 28th Dec. 2019

Centre for Gender Studies of Symbiosis Law School, Hyderabad (SLSH) organized a Panel Discussion on “Combating Violence against Women- Role of Youth,” on 28th December 2019. On this occasion **Smt. C Anusuya, Deputy Commissioner of Police Cyberabad, Dr. Ipsita Sapra, Associate Professor of TISS Hyderabad and M. Shravya Reddy, Founder of We & She Organization** were invited as the panelists.

Prof. (Dr.) Sarfaraz Ahmed Khan, Director, Symbiosis Law School, Hyderabad felicitated the guests and delivered the welcome address. Prof. Khan informed the participants that India ranks 125th in Gender Inequality Index and 87th in the Global Gender Gap Index. He also highlighted that almost 30 per cent of every married woman aged 15-49 years’ experience physical and/or sexual violence at least once in their lifetime. He referred to Crime in India report according to which almost 94% perpetrators of rape are known to victims. These statistics and incidents only indicate that women in India have been subjected to violence in almost every part of the country irrespective of strata of society. He emphasized that the situation can only improve if youth are not only sensitized but are also guided to take positive steps in achieving sex-equality.

Smt. C Anusuya, the Chief Guest of the discussion graced the occasion by enlightening and interacting with the students of Symbiosis Law School and shared her thoughts on the issue of gender sensitization and the growing incidents of online stalking. She raised her concern on the impediments in way of making the society sensitive about women’s safety and urged to stop violence and harassment against women at large. She also pointed towards the formal and informal learning inside and outside the house. She opined that it is everyone’s responsibility to safeguard the interest of women in the society. Students of Symbiosis Law School, Hyderabad were fortunate to have interacted with Smt. C Anusuya who guided the students towards taking steps on sensitizing the youth on gender based discrimination and violence against women. Her practical experience made the students more aware and critical about the wrongful acts against woman.

We were fortunate to have **Dr. Ipsita Sapra**, Associate Professor in TISS Hyderabad, as one of the panelists, who focused on equality and discrimination of treatment between men and women in the society. She emphasized on the poor treatment of Dalit woman and spoke on how we have failed as a society to empower this community. She rightly pointed out that the distinction between patriarchy and inequality and urged everyone to believe that every individual is a feminist directly or indirectly.

M. Shravya Reddy, an active social worker and founder of *We & She Foundation*, Hyderabad traced on the small but influential way of treating the girl child in the society. She shared her experiences about the bias treatment of girls by her own parents. She remarked that, sensitive youth is the only solution to make the society better.

SHE Team of the Nandigama Police presented a video on combating crime against women and circulated a poster conveying an influential message. It was a very helpful talk which motivated the students and guided them on making youth aware of protection of women and their rights and making a society gender-friendly. Near about 110 students were present and actively participated in panel discussion. Dr. Priyanka Mohod, Faculty In-charge of Centre for Gender Studies delivered the Vote of Thanks.







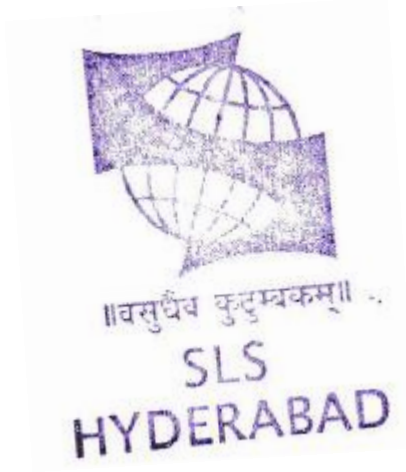
