# **PARTICIPANTS**

The seminar focuses on different areas of crime prevention and control and aims to bring together thoughts of academicians, scholars, students, policy makers, police authorities, NGOs, Members of Judiciary, Government officials, experts and legal professionals from all around the world.

## **SUBMISSION GUIDELINES**

The submission for the seminar shall be two-fold in nature: Firstly, an abstract shall be sent which shall be subjected to initial scrutiny. Lastly, if the abstract is selected, a research paper shall be sent following upon the same.

### **ABSTRACT**

- The word limit for abstract is 300-400 words in Times New Roman, 12 font size, 1.5 spacing.
- The abstract must be accompanied with a cover letter with details of author(s) in .doc/.docx format only. The biographical details must include Title of the paper, Name of the author(s), designation, Institutional affiliation, contact no. and email address.
- The abstract should be sent through google form link.
- The abstract must be submitted on or before at 11:59 pm on February 3rd, 2020.
- The selection of abstracts would be intimated by February 5th, 2020.
- The maximum number of authors for each abstract/paper shall not exceed two.
- A committee will review the abstracts and only shortlisted abstracts shall be required to send their full-length papers who would have the privilege of presenting their paper at this seminar.

### **FULL PAPER**

- The full paper should be of 4000-6000 words (exclusive of footnotes) and needs to be submitted on or before at 11: 59 pm on February 17th, 2020
- The body of the submission must be in Times New Roman, 12 Font Size and 1.5 spacing.
- The footnotes must be in Times New Roman, 10 font size and single spacing. Citation Format: Bluebook 20th Edition
- The margin of 1 inch on all sides must be maintained throughout the paper.
- All submissions should be sent in .doc/.docx format only.
- Any non-compliance with the prescribed guidelines would lead to prima facie rejection.
- No part of the paper should have been published earlier nor should it be under consideration for publication.
- The papers submitted will be subject to plagiarism check.
- All the submissions regarding Full Paper a link will be shared to the selected abstracts.
- Selected Papers may be published in a book or journal.



# **GUIDELINES FOR PAPER PRESENTATION**

The sessions will be grouped according to the theme of the paper. Each presenter will be given 10 minutes for the presentation of the paper. An open discussion shall be conducted after presentation of each paper. The paper presenters can make use of any suitable mode of presentation. It shall be upon the discretion of the author(s) to make use of presentation tools shall as PowerPoint, Prezi etc.

## **Event Report**

### **National Seminar on Crime Prevention and Control**

The National Seminar on Crime Prevention and Control kick started with an inauguration ceremony on the 29th of February, 2020, honouring the Chief Guests Mr. Umapati, IPS Retired Additional Inspector General of Police and Prof. Dr. V Balakista Reddy, Registrar, NALSAR. Panel members Dr. Girjesh Shukla, Mr. Riju Raj Jamwal, Mr. Faisal Fasih and Mr. Chirag Balyan were welcomed and felicitated by Dr. Sarfaraz Ahmed Khan, Director Symbiosis Law School, Hyderabad. An enlightening speech was delivered by Dr. Balakista emphasising the importance of regulation of the highly developed technology of the present day.

He explained the demand for legislation to curb the crimes that evolve with technology. He also addressed the challenges faced by the International Criminal Courts and motivated the participants to contribute ideas for improving the policies and methods of incorporation. The gathering was then addressed by Mr. Umapati, who has an experience of investigation of around five thousand grave crimes. He shared his experience of visiting twenty seven countries around the globe during his period of service. He opined that the Indian Criminal Justice System lags behind in Speedy Justice System and in Victim Compensation which he believes to be the most important component of Justice system. He appreciated the policies provided by the judges in various landmark cases and the necessity to implement them through word of law. He shared his enriching professional experience and criticised the lethargic attitude of law enforcement due to political pressure and said that with active collaboration with NGO's, use of technology and a determined mind, a crime free society can be achieved.

The gathering then proceeded for the plenary and technical session scheduled for the day. The first Plenary session on day one had five presenters namely, Dr. Girjesh Shukla, (Associate Professor and Dean Academics at Himachal Pradesh national Law University, Shimla); Mr. Riju Raj Jamwal (Advocate, Supreme Court of India); Mr. Faisal Fasih, (Assistant Professor, Maharashtra National Law University, Nagpur); Dr. Rengasamy Stalin, (Assistant Professor, Maharashtra National University, Nagpur); Mr. Chirag Balyan, (Assistant Professor, Maharashtra National University, Mumbai). The esteemed dignitaries presented their papers and enlightened the students and the participants on various themes like Mob and Riot Culture, Cyber Crime and Terrorism and Drugs Trafficking.

With the end of the plenary session, at 5:00 pm, began the First technical session of the event. There were twelve presentations with a total of twenty-two participants presenting on the themes of Role of Media in Crime prevention; Prevention of Rioting, Mob Lynching and Mass Atrocities; Prevention of Crimes of the New Millennium: Cyber Crime and Cyber Terrorism; prevention of Drugs and arms Trafficking. The session lasted for a period of two hours, each team presenting for an average of eight minutes, which was followed by a question answer session by the panel and the participants of the seminar.

### **TECHNICAL SESSION 3- DAY 2**

Day 2 started off with the Plenary Session-II at 10:00am. The Plenary session on day two had three esteemed presenters namely, Prof. (Dr.) Mehraj Uddin Mir (Vice Chancellor, Central University of Kashmir); Ms. Geeta Luthra (Senior Advocate, Supreme Court of India); Prof. (Dr.) K I Vibhute, (Director, Amity Law School, Amity University, Mumbai). The esteemed dignitaries presented their papers and enlightened the students and the participants on various themes relating to Crime Prevention and Control. The themes for Technical Sessions 2 & 3 were Prevention of Crimes against Women and Children; Prevention of Human Trafficking; Crime Prevention and Community Policing; Role of Legislation, Law Enforcement and Judiciary in Crime Prevention & Crime Prevention and Public Policy; Crime Prevention and Restorative Justice; Prevention of National/Transnational Organised Crimes respectively.

The third technical session started off with **Seeba Ramzani and Rithani** presenting their paper on prevention of crime. Their paper included prevention of crime with respect to sexual harassment of women. They also spoke about how mass media can help in preventing crime. they also stated that media has brought in peace when the authorities have failed to do so. The duo also highlighted the measure introduced by the Government.

The next presenter was **Mohd. Suheab** on use and abuse of crime prevention. The paper covered various aspects including Section 144 CRPC and right to protest. The paper concentrated on this right and specifically on the recent protests. The paper also included the role and media in preventing crime. media has selective procedure of choosing the right victim. Example of Nirbhaya and Vishakavs State of Rajasthan.



The event ended with the Valedictory Ceremony at 4:00pm which included the certificate distribution and felicitation of the chair persons of the Technical Sessions over the two days.
