Due to the intricacies of the business world and the quick change we witness all around us, it is frequently necessary to fine-tune learning to meet the specific needs of law students.

The streams in corporate law are complicated and repeating, therefore practical experience helps to make corporate law learning more fascinating and effective and to facilitate the same, the 2nd National Corporate Restructuring Competition will be held by the Centre for Corporate and Competition Law at Symbiosis Law School, Hyderabad.

This competition will provide expert conceptual practical insights into the nuances to various methodologies and strategies of the corporate restructuring. The competition will be based on fictional company under distress and the participants would be expected to provide best solutions to come out of the problems.

- To study the importance and scope of Corporate Restructuring.
- To provide students an opportunity to get first-hand experience of the business situations.

AIM OF THE CORPORATE RESTRUCTURING

- To help the students in carving new ways of restructuring through innovative ideas.
- To expand the knowledge of each student in analyzing the business situations for development strategies in business through restructuring.

RULES OF THE COMPETITION

COMPOSITION OF TEAMS

- Teams will consist of 2-3 students who must be enrolled in their school at the time of the competition.
- It is expected, but not required, that the students will mostly be either Law or business School.
- Teams should not obtain aid in solving the case from individuals who are not part of the team, and will be asked to certify that the work product they submit at the competition is their own.

CASE VEHICLE

The case vehicle, concerning a distressed company, will describe the company and the industry in which it operates. It will present the challenges facing the decision-makers in determining the appropriate restructuring steps to take.

Ancillary information about the company, industry and market data and some basic restructuring and bankruptcy principles will be provided in the case vehicle.

The case competition is not intended to be a fact-finding exercise for the teams.

The material included in the case vehicle is meant to provide all the information required for the case, and information or facts outside the case materials should not be considered (and will not be considered by the judges if presented).

PRESENTATIONS

- As stated in the case materials and as reflected on the competition schedule, the competition will consist of submitting written materials and making presentations, as advisors to the company, to separate panels of judges. The competition will be conducted in an online manner via Microsoft Teams.
- All teams will be required to submit the written materials and participate in one round of presentation. Following the completion of the presentations, the judges will meet and consider the performance of the teams considering both the written materials and the presentations.

ELIMINATIONS

1. After the first round the teams with ranks 9-20 will be eliminated.
2. Teams with ranks 1-8 will proceed to the second round.
3. The top 4 teams of the second round will proceed to the semi - final.
4. Two teams will qualify for the final rounds.

Each team's presentation should not exceed a limited amount of pages and is likely to include the items listed below, each as set forth in the instructions that will accompany the case materials:

- Liquidity analysis, including 13 week cash forecast
- Capital structure analysis, including the relative viewpoint of each constituent
 - Debt capacity
 - Prospects for new capital
 - Evaluation
 - Operational alternatives
 - Timeline(s)

Except as necessary as a tiebreaker, no points or rankings will be carried over from the first two presentations to the final presentations.

JUDGING CRITERIA

Each presentation will be evaluated by the panel of judges on the basis of the quality of the analysis and presentation in the following areas:

- Financial and Operational Analysis
- Transaction Structure
- Implementation Strategy
- Demonstration of understanding of negotiation dynamics
- Creativity (Presentations)

Particular focus should be directed to compelling arguments, good analyses, likelihood of success, understanding of the dynamics among various constituencies and oral skills. It is important that the presentation demonstrates a thorough consideration of viable alternatives and provides detailed reasoning for recommendations. As with most cases, there is not necessarily a right or wrong answer. The judges will be looking for the quality of the analysis and reasoning in evaluating the presentation.
