By an amendment to the section it also prescribed disqualifications on which a person is neither eligible to contest election nor continue to be in office on incurring any of the disqualification after being elected. The disqualifications were; 1. Persons facing charges for offences punishable with imprisonment for not less than 2 years; 2. Persons failing to pay arrears/debts to a co-operative society or district Co-operative Bank; 3. Persons not having functional toilets at their residence; 4. Persons having more than two children. 'Z' challenged the validity of section 175 of the Act and disqualifications no. 3 and 4 mainly on the ground of violation of fundamental right to contest elections and filed a writ petition.
