2QA. In the suburbs of a renowned pilgrim town where lakhs of pilgrims visit every year, there are two tanks 'A' and 'P' which were the only sources of water for that area. The Government of 'Z' State issued orders to alienate the 'A' tank bed area to 'Z' Housing Board for housing purposes. An NGO filed a writ petition in the High Court against the alienation and prayed the Court to issue directions to the government for revival of the two tanks and prohibit further constructions. The High Court dismissed the petition. Aggrieved by the High Court's order, the NGO filed an appeal before the Supreme Court.

Discuss the constitutional validity of the writ petition filed by the NGO. Is the High Court order for dismissal valid? Critically evaluate the relevant constitutional provisions and its interpretation in the light of landmark judgments. (CO3 & CO5)

OR

2QB. A State University was offering three year LL.B course through evening classes and the admission rules restrict the classes to be offered only to regular employees of Government and semi-governmental institutions. Employees in general and private sector employees were denied admission to the evening classes of the said course. A group of private employees who applied to pursue three year LL.B course through evening classes and they were denied admission based on the admission rules. They filed a petition before the High Court challenging the admission rule as violative of their Fundamental Right.

Discuss the constitutionality of the challenge made by the private employees. Critically evaluate the relevant provisions of the Constitution of India in the light of landmark judgments. (CO2 & CO4)

3QA. The Arya Samaj, a reformist movement which believes in one God and the Vedas as books of true knowledge has a set up of distinct organization, the membership of which is open to all those who subscribe to its aims and objectives and believe in the Vedic interpretation set by its founder. 'X' College Trust, in order to perpetuate the memory of the founder of Arya Samaj runs various institutions. Under bye-law 32 of the Constitution of the Arya Samaj the proceedings of all meetings and sub-committees will have to be written in Arya Bhasha-In Hindi language and Devnagari character. The management of the college is administered by the trust and the managing society were affiliated to the 'Z' University constituted under the Act of 1947, before the Punjab Reorganization Act. After the Reorganization of the Punjab State, the Punjab legislature passed the 'Y' University Act of 1961 establishing a 'Y' University. The State Government through a notification notified that all the colleges in the specified areas will cease to be affiliated to 'Z' University and was to be associated with and admitted to the privileges of the new University. The 'Y' University through a notification issued a circular and declared that Punjabi will be the sole medium of instruction in the affiliated colleges. The College Trust challenged the University Circular under Article 32 of the Constitution of India, as infringing the rights of the minorities to have their own medium of instruction.

Discuss the constitutional validity of the challenge by the College Trust. What are Minority Rights? Critically evaluate the Constitutional provisions in the light of decided landmark decisions.

However, due to unforeseen supply chain disruptions, Sarah fails to meet the delivery deadline, causing XYZ Electronics to lose a lucrative distribution deal with a major retailer. XYZ Electronics demands compensation from Sarah as per the indemnity clause. Analyze the enforceability of the indemnity clause in the contract between Sarah and XYZ Electronics under the Indian Contract Act, considering the requirements for valid indemnity contracts. (CO2)
