Decko Prints were given Germany market, whereas the companies in Italy and Finland were given their domestic market share plus share of world market. Decko Prints tried to establish some discussions with Quiloc Intl, for necessary export market for increase their fur textiles production. At this juncture, Quiloc Intl stated that unless Decko Prints sign a new agreement with them, they will give Germany market to Italian company. Discuss the exclusive competence of EU and its binding on member States and determine applicable law in the context of Quiloc Intl's dominance over Decko Prints, what can be remedies available to Decko Prints in the light of abuse of such dominance and possible exemptions under the provisions of Treaty on the functioning of EU.
